Did you know:

The majority of children aged 3-11 go online? This is normally via mobile phones and tablets (Ofcom 2022).

In school we teach online safety and one part of that is asking the children to identify a trusted adult who they can talk to if they feel that something is wrong. This half term, talk to your child about online safety and find out who their trusted adult is at home. Try and establish some rules if you do not already have them and make sure you are involved in their digital life!
