Safer Internet Day 2026

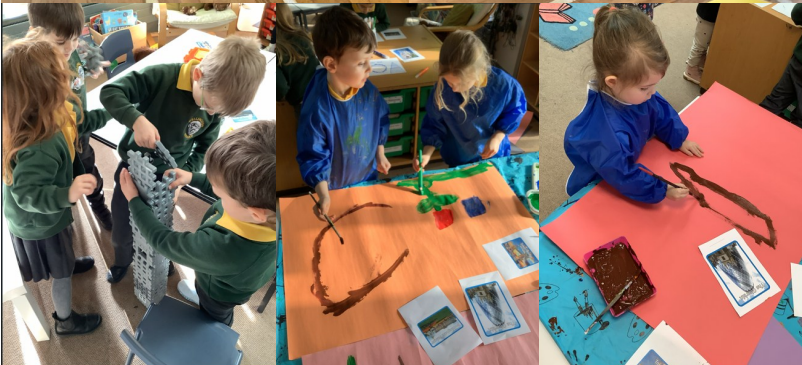
