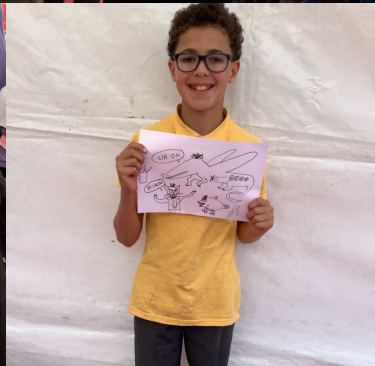
In the afternoon, the children had lots of fun exploring the parklands further, and even found a 'castle park' to play in!
