That peace on earth should grow, grow, grow.

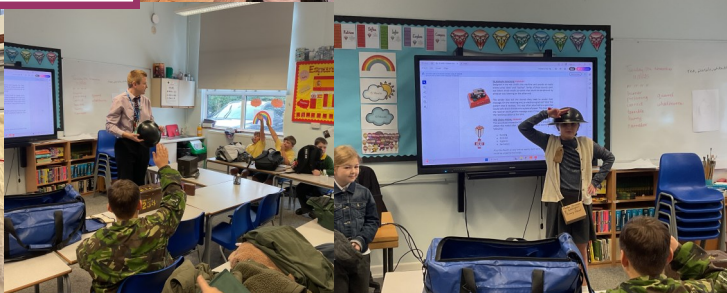
The whole school learnt about the significance of the poppy, and paid their respects to the soldiers on Remembrance Day.
