VOICE

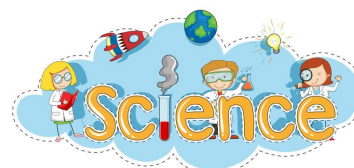
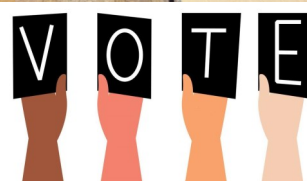
To start 2025, the children at Wellington have been learning about democracy, and the importance of voting to help make a change.
