To start January 2026, the children at Wellington have been learning more about democracy. And the importance of voting to help make a change.

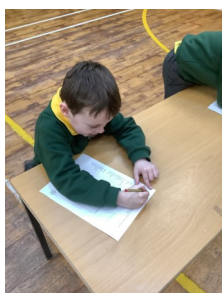
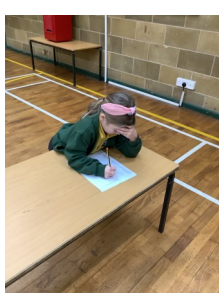

Instead you will receive emails.

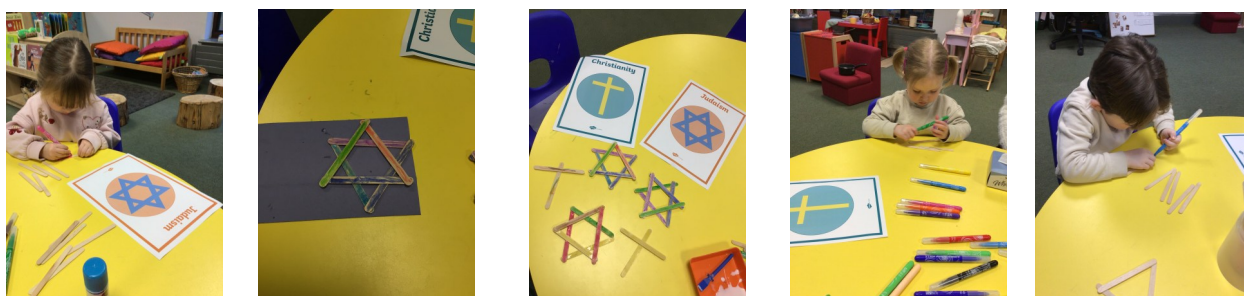
This decision has been made to make our communication more reliable.
